2020

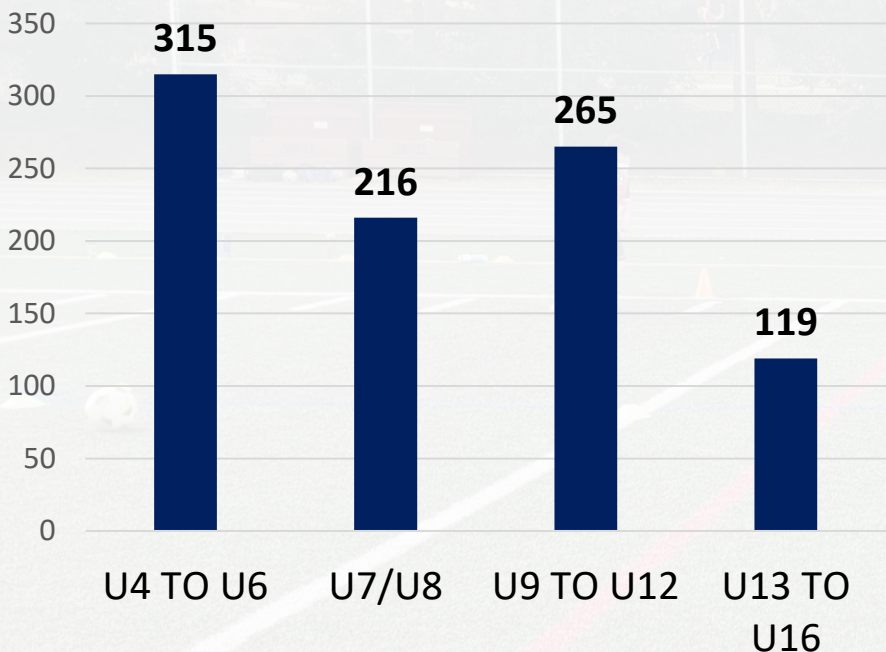
Technical restructuring, implementation of a sports project.

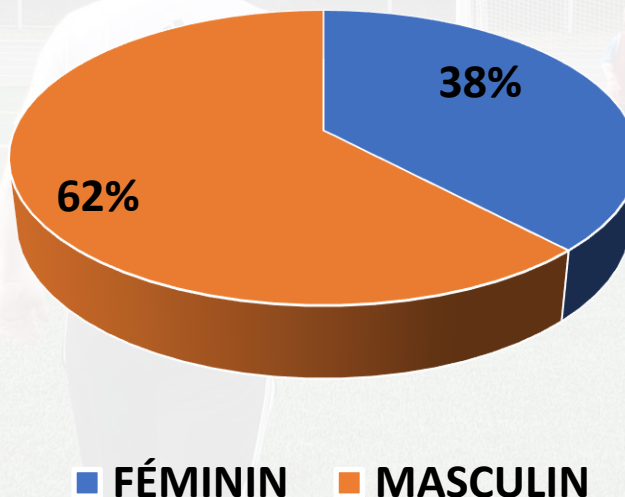


CS AYLMER IN NUMBERS SUMMER SEASON 2021

■ FÉMININ ■ MASCULIN

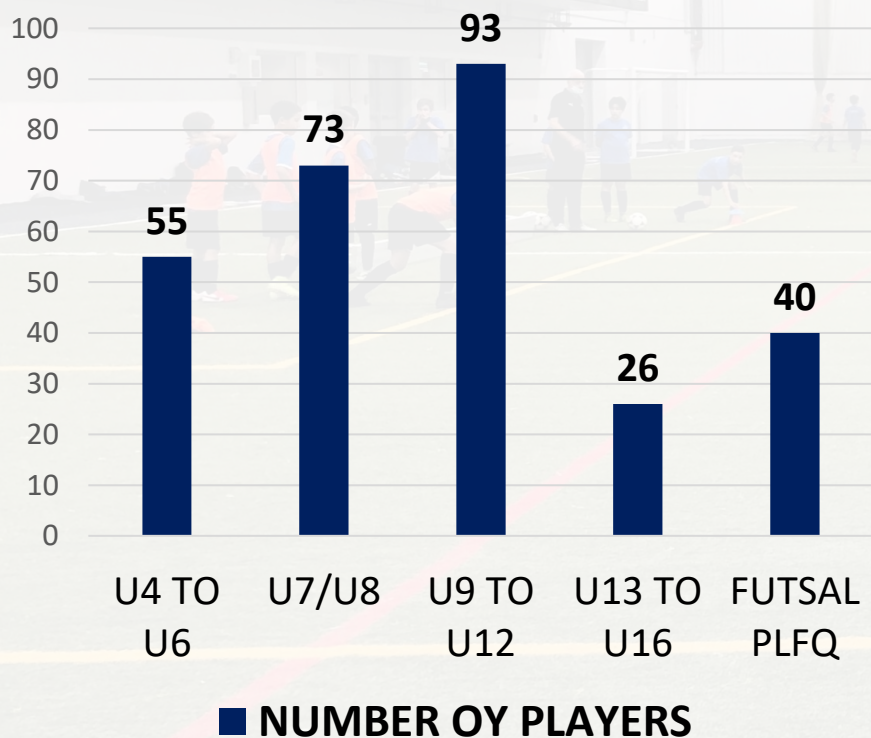

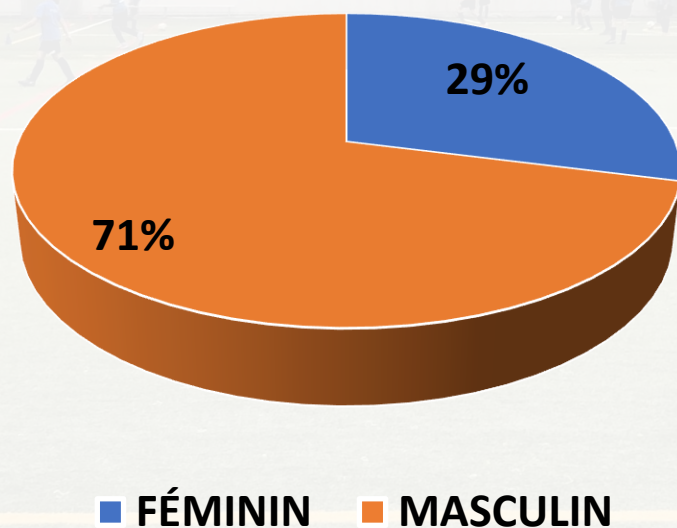

DATA ANALYSIS - THE CHALLENGES

The important proportion of players between U4 and U12 (81% of members in the summer of 2021).

The increase in the population of the Aylmer sector.

Offer an alternative for our children who want to train year round (**Lack of covered infrastructure in the west end of the city**). **Too many differences in registration between summer and winter.**

To maintain a quality and proximity service to all our members.

To perpetuate the progression of the female sector.

TEAM SPIRIT

The friendships forged on the field are among the healthiest and strongest relationships there are. Victory is collective, and so is defeat. The collective sublimates the individual by bringing him to surpass himself.

RESPECT

Self-respect begins with respect for others (e.g., coaches, partners, opponents, referees) and respect for the rules (of the club, the group, the game).

CS AYLMER PROJECT

5-YEAR PROJECT (2022-2027)

The analysis of the figures presented and the requirements imposed by the Soccer Canada Club Recognition Program (CRP) led to the development of a sports project organized according to 5 priority axes

In-house educator training

- Setting up internal training and personalized follow-up. Create future vocations.

Development of the women's section

- Implementation of a project around women's soccer.

Perennialization of the CDC U7 to U12

- Organize CDCs by interest level but also by skill level.

Options for U13 and up:

- Conclusion of partnerships with clubs (AA - AAA) that share our development philosophy
- Continuing to develop our sport within the CSA (A or Local).

Futsal project

- Entry in PLFQ (Quebec Premier Futsal League) + juvenile academy.

INTERNSHIP EDUCATOR TRAINING

Internal training will be essential if the CSA wants to be able to rely on qualified educators to supervise in an optimal way the progression of the players.

Personalized follow-up by educators (observation sheet).

Internal training is essential to follow the policy put in place by the CS Aylmer.

Meet or exceed the requirements of the Club Recognition Program.

Carry out the trainings set up by Soccer Outaouais and Quebec.

The CS Aylmer must train educators, not coaches

The main mission of the educator is to train and develop players by instilling sporting and educational values.

CS AYLMER PROJECT



DEVELOPMENT OF THE WOMEN'S SECTOR

Female participation is increasing in the Aylmer sector. This section will be the object of a particular organization, adapted to the specificities of the sport and pedagogy of female players.

Have a technical reference in this sector.

Have trained and competent educators.

To propose gatherings in this sector (promotion, publicity...)

Set up a development structure and individualized follow-up.

Sectorizing our female athletes will allow us to establish a development project specific to their needs.

CS AYLMER PROJECT



PERPETUATION OF THE U7 TO U12 CDC

Club Development Centres (CDC) are a requirement of Soccer Canada. They allow players to develop their skills in workshops specific to their needs.

Organize different CDCs by interest and skill level.

Create an Academy area.

Rely on trained and competent educators.

One of the objectives of the CDC is to **promote the notion of belonging** to CS Aylmer. The child is first and foremost a member of the club and no longer a member of a club team.

CS AYLMER PROJECT



OPTIIONS FOR U13 AND UP:

2 options will be available for our players depending on their interest and quality.

U13 AND UP AYLMER SECTOR

- A quality, local service for ages 13 and up.
- A and local level
- Continuation of the work done during the CDC U9 to U12

PARTNERSHIP

- 2 partner clubs of different levels (AA and AAA) in order to orient our U13 and older players.
- Elaboration of an agreement protocol.
- Putting the partner club in contact with the parents

The CS Aylmer will continue to offer a local or A service in U13 and up. The technical committee will communicate at the end of each winter season (U12 to U13) with the children who are potentially AA or AAA to propose an orientation.

CS AYLNER PROJECT



FUTSAL PROJECT

The lack of a year-round indoor facility in West Gatineau makes futsal a development opportunity for our players in the fall and winter.

To perpetuate the PLFQ team of the CS Aylmer.

Create a juvenile futsal academy.

Develop partnerships with primary and secondary schools in the Aylmer sector.

To rely on competent and trained futsal educators.

Futsal is in full expansion in the province but also in the Outaouais region. It is becoming one of **the most practiced sports in the school environment**. It is still a "young" sport that needs to be developed and the Aylmer School Board must be involved in this project.

This 5-year sports project (2022-2027) is an ambitious project. It will serve as a reference for the development and training of our players.
